Progress Toward Decreasing Preventable Childbirth Deaths in Low and Middle Income Countries (but the fruit does not hang as low as it seems)

I just returned after spending 3 months in Senegal as part of Merck's Global Health Fellowship program. Three women and I worked with <u>Africare</u>, an NGO, on a project to contribute to education of teens and their families about sexual and reproductive health, with the ultimate goal of decreasing maternal mortality by decreasing rates of teen pregnancy. Working intensively and exclusively on a single project, not to mention living dormitory style in an apartment with 3 strangers in a Low-Middle Income Country (LMIC), were quite different experiences from my usual style of work and life. <u>More</u>
