

Tech Tip: New Portal Tool—Update Your Own Bio

We are saddened to report the recent death of Clarence T. Saski, MD, our author of Laryngeal Disorders and Oral and Pharyngeal Disorders. Dr. Sasaki was Charles W. Ohse Professor Emeritus of Surgery at the Yale School of Medicine. Dr. Sasaki was the longest-serving Chief of Otolaryngology at Yale, having served for 30 years. Even after his retirement from clinical practice in 2020, Dr. Sasaki continued to serve as a mentor to members of the Department of Surgery. Dr. Sasaki's commitment to research and education resulted in the publication of more than 400 journal articles and 6 textbooks. He will be missed.
