End-of-Year Message from Dr. Porter

I'd like to thank all of you for your hard work in 2018! As many of you know, we've been making a major push to make The Manuals' content more current, and thanks to all your efforts we've been very successful. Currently, over half of our topics date from 2018 and nearly all the rest are from 2017!

Because we all write and read the English version, we may forget that The Manuals are online in 9 other languages and are a very popular resource in many non-English speaking countries. Our websites are on track to have 175 million user sessions this year, an average of almost 500,000 per day! Our free, full-content Merck Manual apps are available in 5 languages and have been downloaded about 850,000 times this year. Thus, your efforts are having a significant impact throughout the world.

Next year, we will be launching a major upgrade to all the websites, with improved navigation and functionality. We also will launch a Consumer Version in Arabic and a Professional Version in Vietnamese.

One Health Initiative: The Intersection of Human and Veterinary Medicine in The Manuals

In the spirit of the One Health Initiative, The Merck Manual and The Merck Veterinary Manual partnered to write a <u>commentary regarding antimicrobial</u> <u>stewardship</u>.

Dr. Porter and Dr. Scott Line, editor-in-chief of the Merck Vet Manual, spoke with members of both editorial boards. From their conversation, an editorial, "<u>Antimicrobial Resistance and the Human-Animal</u> <u>Interface</u>," was developed. The editorial discussed the scope of the problem of antimicrobial resistance in human and veterinary medicine and strategies physicians and veterinary practitioners are using to combat resistance in their practices.

To accompany the editorial, we commissioned a new <u>video</u> on mechanisms of antimicrobial resistance. We hope the editorial, together with the video, provide a helpful refresher on the problem of antimicrobial resistance.
